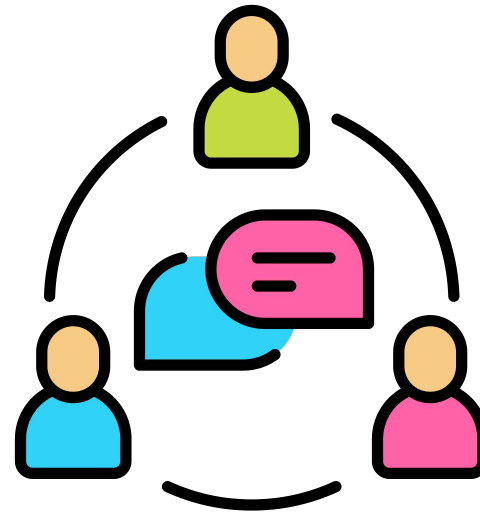

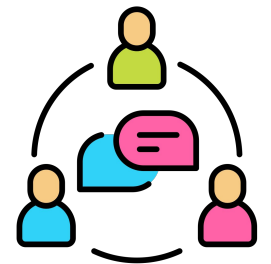

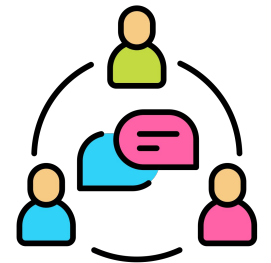

Propaganda

- **Definition**

- “The purpose of propaganda is to influence the opinions, beliefs, attitudes, and behaviors of a target population. The goal could be as concrete and specific as influencing voting or protesting behaviors or abstract as sowing discord among the populace. Oftentimes, the propaganda aims to encourage people to adopt the ideology of the propagandist, preferably without them becoming aware of the persuasion attempt. [...] Propaganda is often employed at times of war or conflict to influence the opinions and behaviors of both local and foreign audiences.” (Walter & Ophir, 2023)

Propaganda

- **Types**

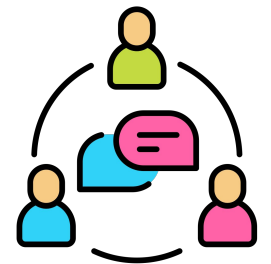
- **White:** publicity activities that involve communicating a message from a known source
- **Gray:** obfuscated communication from an unattributed or obfuscated source, e. g. some type of astroturfing
- **Black:** falsely attributing messages to different entities, e. g. a hostile source, in order to stir up hate, or cause it to lose credibility (Farkas & Neumayer, 2020)
- **Vertical:** “administered and controlled by elites and formal institutions (e.g., political or religious)”
- **Horizontal:** “made from the ground up in a nonhierarchical fashion (Walter & Ophir, 2023)”

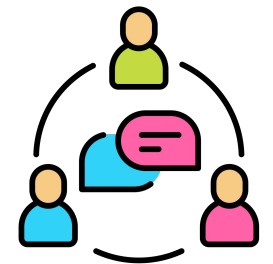

Propaganda

- In your group: White, gray, or black propaganda, vertical or horizontal propaganda?
 - **Cold war:** Secret campaign by the British government targeting states in Africa, the Middle East, and parts of Asia with leaflets and reports from fake sources to discredit cold war enemies. It was run from the 1950s to the late 70s. Documents spread hatred of Israel to appear authentic (Burke, 2022)

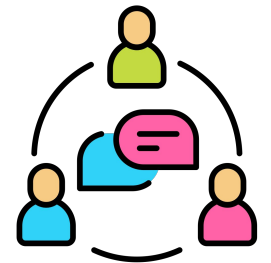
- In your group: White, gray, or black propaganda, vertical or horizontal propaganda?
